How do I Become a Member?

Membership in the League of Women Voters of Seattle is open to men and women. Dues are \$60 per year and include membership in the LWV of Washington and the LWV of the US.

VOTER REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Who can register to vote?

To be eligible to vote, you must be a U.S. citizen, at least 18 years old, a resident of Washington State and have full civil rights. Persons convicted of a felony lose their civil rights and the right to vote. Upon completion of their sentences and once their rights are restored by the court where they were convicted, individuals must re-register to vote. Individuals may register if their sentences have been overturned or they have been pardoned.

What are the registration deadlines?

You must register at least 30 days before an election. New voters in Washington can register in person at King County Elections up to 15 days prior to the election. You may register if you are 17 years old but will turn 18 on or before the next Election Day.

Where can I register?

In 2008, Washington State began offering online voter registration at www.secstate.wa.gov. You can also obtain a mail-in form at the following locations:

- King County Elections, 919 SW Grady Way in Renton;
- King County Community Service Centers;
- The League of Women Voters of Seattle, 1620 18th Ave in Seattle;
- City and town clerks, public schools, libraries and fire stations; and
- Motor Voter registration: Residents may register to vote or transfer their voter registration when applying for or renewing a driver's license or state identification card.

What if I move or change my name?

If you move within Washington state or change your name, you must complete a new voter registration form. Voters moving within King County may change their address by calling the Elections office at (206) 296-VOTE (8683).

In December 2007, King County Elections moved to 919 SW Grady Way in Renton. There are no longer offices in downtown Seattle. King County Elections is open weekdays from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, and can be reached at 206-296-VOTE (8683), and elections@kingcounty.gov. More information and directions can be found at www.kingcounty.gov/elections.

VOTE BY MAIL IN KING COUNTY

In 2009, King County joined 37 of Washington's 39 counties and now conducts all elections by mail. All eligible, registered voters are mailed a ballot 20 days before each election. This convenient way of voting reduces the complexity of conducting elections and allows resources to be spent on the voting method that the majority of voters prefer. You will automatically receive a ballot in the mail for each election that you are eligible to vote in; there is no need to re-register.

All voters should follow these guidelines when voting their mail ballot:

- Carefully follow all instructions for voting your ballot and never sign your ballot.
- Your signature on the mailing envelope makes your vote count. As required by law, the signature on every vote-by-mail return envelope

is verified against the voter's registration record. If your signature has changed over the years, please update your records with King County Elections.

-Respond immediately if you are contacted by King County Elections. You may have forgotten to sign the return envelope or your signature may not match your voter registration record. Elections officials go to great lengths to contact voters, but rely on a timely response.

-To be counted, mail ballots must be postmarked by Election Day. Ballots without postage can be returned to a 24-hour ballot drop box until 8 p.m. on Election Day.

Ballot Drop Boxes

Voters have two ways of returning their voted ballot: through the U.S. Postal Service or at 24-hour, secured ballot drop boxes located throughout the county. These boxes are open 18 days leading up to and including Election Day until 8:00 p.m.. For locations of drop boxes, go to www.kingcounty.gov/elections or call the Elections office at (206) 296-VOTE (8683).

Ballot Tracking

Voters can track their mail ballot's progress online as it is processed. Learn more online at kingcounty.gov/elections.

Accessible Voting Options are Available

Voters with disabilities have the opportunity to cast a private and independent ballot at one of several accessible voting centers located throughout the county.

The equipment at these locations provides audio and visual technology which allows voters with limited vision and physical disabilities to vote independently. For locations, hours and more information, visit www.kingcounty.gov/elections.

Chinese Information

Federal law requires King County to produce all election material in both English and Chinese. If you need language assistance or would like a ballot and voters' pamphlet in Chinese, call 206-296-8683.

ADDRESSING OFFICIALS

Include your name and address when writing or e-mailing your elected officials. Letters to the President and Vice President should be addressed to the President or the Vice President. The correct salutations are: "Dear President Doe" or "Dear Mr./Madam President", "Dear Vice President Doe" or "Dear Mr./Madam Vice President."

Letters to other elected officials should be addressed to "The Honorable" plus name, or "Position" plus name, as in the "The Honorable Jane Doe" or "Councilmember Jane Doe."

When the legislature is in session, generally the district offices are not staffed, and it may take some time to hear back from legislators if one does not reach them at their Olympia office. Likewise, it is best to reach the legislators at their district offices when the legislature is out of session. Call the Olympia phone number if no district number is listed.

COURTS

A listing of courts and judges appears in the Government section of the telephone directory Blue Pages. Washington State judges are elected by the voters in their jurisdiction. Jurors in Washington State are drawn from lists of registered voters and licensed drivers.

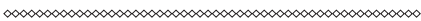
