## VOTER REGISTRATION INFORMATION

### **Who can register to vote?**

To be eligible to vote, you must be a U.S. citizen, at least 18 years old, a resident of Washington State and have full civil rights. Persons convicted of a felony lose their civil rights and the right to vote. Upon completion of their sentences and once their rights are restored by the court where they were convicted, individuals must re-register to vote. Individuals may register if their sentences have been overturned or they have been pardoned.

### **What are the registration deadlines?**

You must register at least 30 days before an election. New Washington state voters can register in person at King County Elections up to 15 days prior to the election. You may register if you are 17 years old but will turn 18 on or before the next Election Day.

### **Where can I register?**

In 2008, Washington State began offering online voter registration at [www.secstate.wa.gov](http://www.secstate.wa.gov). You can also obtain a mail-in form at the following locations:

- King County Elections, 919 SW Grady Way in Renton;
- King County Community Service Centers;
- The League of Women Voters of Seattle, 1620 18th Ave in Seattle;
- City and town clerks, public schools, libraries and fire stations; and
- Motor Voter registration: Residents may register to vote or transfer their voter registration when applying for or renewing a driver's license or state identification card.

### **What if I move or change my name?**

If you move within Washington state or change your name, you must update your voter registration by completing a new voter registration form. Voters moving within King County may change their address by calling the Elections office at (206) 296-VOTE (8683).

### **What should I bring to the polling place?**

State law requires voters to show identification when they vote at the polls. Acceptable forms of ID include: any form of photo identification, a driver's license, state identification card, tribal identification card, voter registration card (excluding records flagged for first identification check), a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check or other government document. If you do not provide identification, a provisional ballot will be issued. If your name is not in the poll book when you go to the polling place, you can vote with a provisional ballot.

### **Is disability accessible voting equipment available?**

Each King County polling place offers an accessible voting unit, a piece of voting equipment that allows voters with visual impairments or other disabilities to cast a secret and independent ballot. When King County conducts all elections by mail, voters can still vote in-person at a regional voting center using an accessible voting unit. These locations will be listed at [www.kingcounty.gov/elections](http://www.kingcounty.gov/elections) once King County transitions to all-mail voting in 2008.

In December 2007, King County Elections moved to 919 SW Grady Way in Renton. There are no longer offices in downtown Seattle. King County Elections is open weekdays from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, and can be reached at 206-296-VOTE (8683), and [elections@kingcounty.gov](mailto:elections@kingcounty.gov). ## ABSENTEE VOTING

Absentee ballots are available and mailed to voters 20 days prior to each election. Voted ballots must be postmarked on or before Election Day to be valid. King County is transitioning to countywide vote-by-mail elections in 2008, once the infrastructure is in place. Once in place, every voter will receive their ballot in the mail. Registered voters will not have to re-register in order to receive a ballot in the mail. For the time being, voters have the choice of requesting an absentee ballot as follows:

**One-time request:** If you want an absentee ballot for one election only, contact King County Elections for more information at 206-296-VOTE (8683) or complete the form online at [www.kingcounty.gov/elections](http://www.kingcounty.gov/elections). Mail and telephone requests should be made at least one week prior to the election to allow for mailing time; in person requests can be made up to the day before the election. It is critical for absentee voters to report address changes to King County Elections.

**Permanent absentee voters:** All registered voters may receive all ballots by mail by contacting King County Elections at 206-296-VOTE (8683) or [www.kingcounty.gov/elections](http://www.kingcounty.gov/elections). Permanent absentee voters will receive a ballot by mail for all future elections in which they are eligible to vote.

**Military or overseas:** Registered voters in the military or living overseas can have their absentee ballot mailed directly to them. If an absentee ballot does not arrive in time, military and overseas voters can request a faxed or e-mailed ballot.

## VOTE BY MAIL IN KING COUNTY

In 2008, King County will join 37 of Washington's 39 counties and conduct all elections by mail. Voters will receive notification of this change about 90 days prior to the first vote-by-mail election. Voters will have the ability to track their ballot online to confirm that their ballot was mailed on time and received by King County Elections. All polling places will be eliminated but voters with disabilities will still have the option to vote on an accessible voting unit at one of 12 regional voting centers located throughout the county. Thirty-six ballot drop boxes will be installed throughout the county for voters to return their ballot without postage. ## ADDRESSING OFFICIALS

Include your name and address when writing or e-mailing your elected officials. Letters to the President and Vice President should be addressed to the President or the Vice President. The correct salutations are: "Dear President Doe" or "Dear Mr./Madam President", "Dear Vice President Doe" or "Dear Mr./Madam Vice President."

Letters to other elected officials should be addressed to "The Honorable" plus name, or "Position" plus name, as in the "The Honorable Jane Doe" or "Councilmember Jane Doe."

**When the legislature is in session, generally the district offices are not staffed, and it may take some time to hear back from legislators if one does not reach them at their Olympia office.** Likewise, it is best to reach the legislators at their district offices when the legislature is out of session. Call the Olympia phone number if no district number is listed.

## COURTS

A listing of courts and judges appears in the Government section of the telephone directory Blue Pages. Washington State judges are elected by the voters in their jurisdiction. Jurors in Washington State are drawn from lists of registered voters and licensed drivers.
