How do I Become a Member?

Membership in the League of Women Voters of Seattle-King County is open to men and women. Dues are \$60 per year and include membership in the LWV of Washington and the LWV of the US.

VOTER REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Who can register to vote?

To qualify to register to vote, you must be a citizen of the United States, a legal resident of Washington State at least 18 years old by Election Day and not under the authority of the Department of Corrections and not disqualified from voting due to a court order.

Where can I register?

Online voter registration is available through the Secretary of State's website at www.vote.wa.gov Mail-in registration forms are available online at www.kingcounty.gov/elections or call 206-296-VOTE (8683).

What are the registration deadlines?

A voter who is already registered to vote in Washington may update his or her registration at least 29 days before the election they wish to vote in. A person who is not registered to vote in Washington can do so online or by mail at least 29 days before the election, or in person at King County Elections at least eight days before the election they wish to vote in. Specific dates can be found at www.kingcounty.gov/elections.

What if I move or change my name?

A registered voter who changes his or her residence within King County can transfer their registration to the new address in one of the following ways:

- Online at www.vote.wa.gov
- E-mail name and date of birth along with old and new address to elections@kingcounty.gov.
- Send a written request to King County Elections,
- Call 206-296-VOTE (8683), or
- Submit a new voter registration form

If you move from one county to another, simply go online or fill out a new voter registration form to update your address. If this update is not made at least 29 days before election day, you may vote according to your previous registration address.

If you move to a new state, you must re-register with your new elections office. Please help keep our voter rolls current and cancel your previous registration with King County Elections. This information must be submitted in writing along with your signature.

Changing your name is easy. To do so, go online, complete a new voter registration form or contact King County Elections in writing with the following information: voter's registered and new names, along with your current address and signature.

King County Elections is open weekdays from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., and can be reached at 206-296-VOTE (8683), and elections@kingcounty.gov. More information and directions can be found at www.kingcounty.gov/elections.

VOTE BY MAIL IN KING COUNTY

In 2009, King County began conducting all elections by mail.

All eligible, registered voters are mailed a ballot 20 days before each election. Voters will automatically receive a ballot in the mail for each election that they are eligible to vote in. Make sure your address is current, so your ballot reaches you.

All voters should follow these guidelines when voting their mail ballot:

- Carefully follow all instructions for voting and read your ballot carefully.
- Your signature makes your vote count. The signature on every ballot envelope is verified against the voter's registration record. If your signature has changed over the years, please update your records with King County Elections.
- Respond immediately if you are contacted by the Elections office. You may have forgotten to sign the return envelope or your signature may not match your voter registration record. Elections officials attempt to contact voters, but rely on a timely response.
- Use only a black ink pen to vote.
- To be counted, mail ballots must be postmarked by Election Day. Voters have two ways of returning their voted ballot: through the U.S. Postal Service with a first-class stamp and postmarked no later than Election Day; or at a secured ballot drop box by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. For box locations, visit www.kingcounty.gov/elections.

Ballot drop boxes

If you choose not to mail your ballot, you may drop it off until 8:00 p.m. on Election Day at the office of King County Elections or at a ballot drop box. The location and number of drop boxes may vary from election to election. Call or check online in advance.

Ballot tracking

Your ballot travels a long way from the time it's printed, mailed to you and returned to our office. Voters can track their mail ballot's progress online as it is processed at www.kingcounty.gov/elections.

Accessible voting options are available

Voters with disabilities can cast a private and independent ballot at one of three accessible voting centers located throughout the county.

The equipment at these locations provides audio and visual technology which allows voters with limited vision and physical disabilities to vote independently. For locations, hours and more information, visit www.kingcounty.gov/elections.

Chinese and Vietnamese information

Federal law requires King County to produce all election material in Chinese and Vietnamese in addition to English. If you need language assistance or would like a ballot and voters' pamphlet in Chinese or Vietnamese, call 206-296-8683.

ADDRESSING OFFICIALS

Include your name and address when writing or e-mailing your elected officials. Letters to the President and Vice President should be addressed to the President or the Vice President. The correct salutations are: "Dear President Doe" or "Dear Mr./Madam President", "Dear Vice President Doe" or "Dear Mr./Madam Vice President."

Letters to other elected officials should be addressed to "The Honorable" plus name, or "Position" plus name, as in the "The Honorable Jane Doe" or "Councilmember Jane Doe."

When the legislature is in session, generally the district offices are not staffed, and it may take some time to hear back from legislators if one does not reach them at their Olympia office. Likewise, it is best to reach the legislators at their district offices when the legislature is out of session. Call the Olympia phone number if no district number is listed.

COURTS

Washington State judges are elected by the voters in their jurisdiction. Jurors in Washington State are drawn from lists of registered voters, licensed drivers, and state identification card holders.

2010 CENSUS INFORMATION

The U.S. census is conducted every 10 years. The current U.S. population is 308,745,538. Washington's population increased 14.1% to 6.7 million people between the 2000 and the 2010 census, therefore the state has received a 10th congressional district. The 435 seats in the House of Representatives will be reapportioned so that an equal number of people live in each congressional district. Each congressional district will now have about 672,000 residents. Other considerations when redistricting are: creating compact, contiguous districts, keeping political units and communities within a single district, and avoiding the drawing of boundaries for purposes of partisan advantage or incumbent protection.

Redistricting in Washington State is accomplished by a four-member commission (two Democrats and two Republicans), with a fifth, non-voting chair. There will be about 137,000 in each legislative district. The commission is assisted by the Secretary of State's office.

Legislative redistricting took place during 2011, and the newly apportioned congressional and legislative districts have been approved by all four voting members of the commission. The plan must be approved by the 2012 state legislature and be in place for the 2012 elections.
